Carlson Gets to Meet Chris Nikic

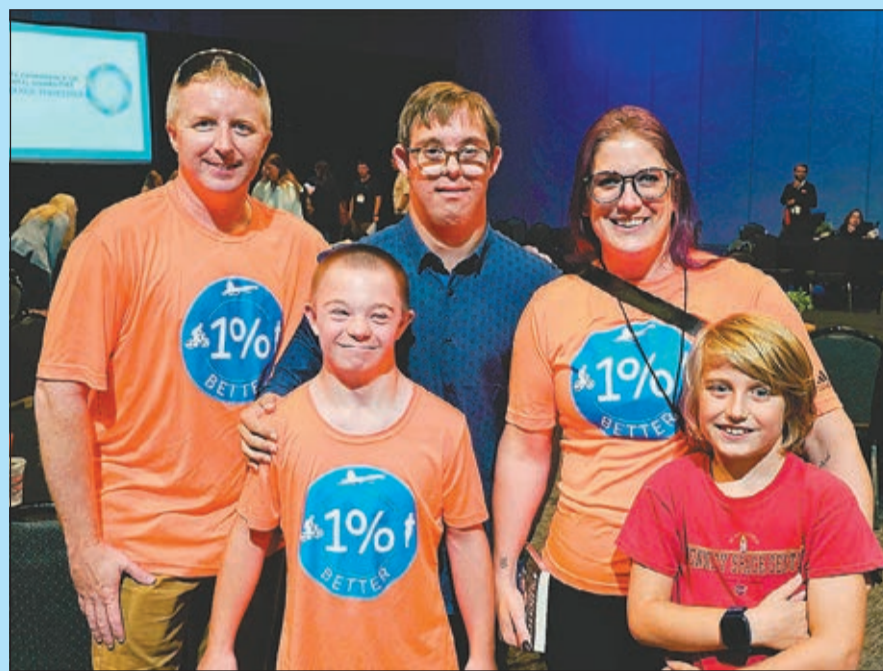
On September 7, 2023, Chris Nikic appeared in Sioux Falls on September 7 as a Keynote Speaker for over 200 attendees at the South Dakota Conference on Developmental Disabilities. This inspiring young man, in November 2020, became the first person with Down syndrome to complete an IRONMAN and is verified by Guinness World Records. Chris has since completed multiple IRONMAN Triathlons as well as competed in the IRONMAN Championship in Kona, Hawaii in early 2023.

The Carlson family had the opportunity to personally meet Chris Nikic at the conference. Chris signed his 1% Better book and gave a copy to Max Carlson, a Canton Middle School 6th grader, as well as personally signed Max's shirt. Chris's Keynote speech inspired South Dakota teachers, administrators, care providers, and families alike.

Chris is currently traveling the World speaking to audiences

about his success, getting better 1% at a time, with the challenges he faces. Chris Nikic is leading the discussion on how regular, strenuous exercise is essential for people with disabilities, like Down syndrome and Autism as it has shown to lead to longer, healthier lives, as well as shown to increase brain activity and pathways in the brain for people with intellectual disabilities.

The Chris Nikic Foundation aims to make physical fitness accessible and achievable for all people with intellectual disabilities in society, schools, and wellness facilities. The Foundation provides grants to gyms, fitness programs, nonprofit organizations, and schools to purchase adaptive equipment to enable people with intellectual



disabilities to be physically active, as well as provides a training program for fitness staff, coaches, and volunteers to instruct the 1% Better model for people with intellectual disabilities.

The Carlson family hopes to work with the South Dakota Special Olympics office to bring some of Chris Nikic's 1% Better campaign to South Dakota through the Special Olympics programs.

Many Attended Tales From the Grave

Last Sunday, September 10th, "Tales from the Grave" was performed for the 4th time. Around 100 people attended. The Board of Directors for the Forest Hill Cemetery Board put this event together as a free-will donation fundraiser to help preserve and maintain the cemetery. The experience included hearing stories from some of Canton's "oldest residents", which was very interesting for local history lovers in attendance. Historical figures from Canton's past were portrayed by some of Canton's current locals. The actors and actresses dressed as the figures they were portraying. The figures were brought to life for a short time through the reenactments.

The event started with the Canton High School alumni band playing in honor of Glenn and Mary Ann Siverson. The band was directed by their daughter, Sayra Siverson. Bill Peterson then welcomed everyone and spoke about the event. Attendees were reminded that everybody has their own story to tell. Peterson then introduced us to our first historical figure, Claude Little.



Claude Little is buried in the 1908 mausoleum which can be seen at the entrance of Forest Hill. Little's father bought that lot. Little worked along with his father and brother, working as a barber at the Rudolph Hotel in Canton. He later moved to Salem, SD but was brought

back to be buried. In Omaha, Little passed away from typhoid fever at age 26. Vandals broke into the mausoleum 20-30 years ago and it was then resealed by cement. The men who investigated the break in found there is also a woman who



The bank closed after Fred and another employee borrowed money they could not pay back. Fred left one night to allegedly go to Sioux Falls for business, never to be seen again. This event was even chronicled in the Sioux Valley News at the time, "Bacon Gone." He left Rosanna and his daughters behind without a word to answer for the ridicule. This forced Rosanna to open a boarding house in their home to support her family. Gordan and Deb Bourne live in the Bacon's home today. Bacon is surrounded by her daughters at the cemetery.

Dwight Slade was portrayed by Mike Block. He lived in the area from December 3rd, 1879-January 2nd, 1963. Slade was born in Eden

(Hudson), South Dakota. His family moved to Canton after his father was elected as Lincoln County Treasurer. He worked as a real-estate agent after attending college for business in Vermillion. He was known as the best singer in Canton and music followed him throughout his life. He sang for many events in the area when he wasn't traveling across the country for work or pleasure. Slade also practiced as a Chiropractor in Canton and served as Lincoln County's Clerk of Courts from 1937-1959. Mike sang us out with one of Slade's favorites "In the Garden."

Morning came but Bacon did not return. Cashier Larsen on advice, decided to close the doors of the bank Saturday, and a notice was posted to this effect before business hours. It is the presumption that Bacon went to Sioux Falls to seek financial aid, but if he did, no one there seems to have met him. Since his arrival in Sioux Falls all trace of his movements are lost.

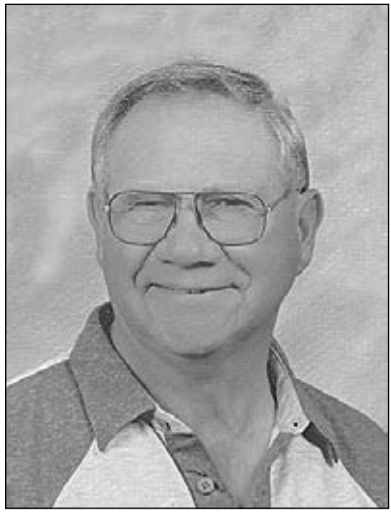

George Kamenar
August 1, 1932 -
September 7, 2023

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of George Kamenar, aged 91. Born Ratimir Juraj Kamenar in Zagreb, Croatia, George spent his formative years in a nation that was ravaged by war, in a city occupied by nazis and bombed by the allies. At age 12, he became separated from his family while they were fleeing from the communist takeover. He eventually found safety in a displaced persons camp in Italy and spent the remainder of his youth as a refugee. When he turned 19, he received an opportunity to relocate and chose to come to the United States, having been sponsored by a family in Davenport, Iowa. During his journey, he passed through Ellis Island. After coming to the United States, he worked in a factory, but his desire to serve and give back to his new country led him to enlist in the US Air Force as a medic. Even prior to becoming a citizen, he served a combat tour in Korea at an Air Force Field Hospital. In October of 1953, while still serving our nation, he felt privileged to be offered US citizenship, at which time he legally changed his name to George.

While in uniform, George met the woman who would become his wife of 68 years, Connie Lentz. Prior to completing his enlistment, George and Connie were married at St. Theresa's Catholic Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. In 1958, after working and living in San Antonio and Kansas City, George and Connie settled in Canton, South Dakota where he took a job as a bookkeeper, production and office manager for Canton Block and Tile. George worked at what would become Canton Concrete Products Inc. for nearly thirty years and for a time concurrently supported bookkeeping needs at Bid-Well Company.

George and Connie raised three children, two boys and a girl. When George's boys were children, he told them they owe a debt of gratitude to our nation for the relative freedoms it provides. He went on to challenge all his children to give back, either through military service, volunteerism, or as an educator. As such, both boys served in the military while his daughter became an educator. Eventually George and Connie relocated to Yankton, where George worked for the South Dakota Highway Patrol and owned a security company. He worked both jobs until he felt it was time to retire, well into his 70's. As a father and community member he served as a Scout Leader, catechism instructor, church choir member and for a time choir leader, was a life member of the VFW, an overly frequent blood donor, and for a while served as a volunteer interpreter at a hospital given that he spoke five languages. He was a voracious reader, loved to visit with family and sing Croatian folk songs, and in later years made several trips to his home country to see family.

Shall Not be Infringed

South Dakota has been setting the standard as the most Second-Amendment-friendly state in the nation for years. We embrace liberty and personal responsibility. We know that our Founding Fathers created a government that recognizes our God-given rights – including the right to defend ourselves, our families, and our Freedoms.

Unfortunately, not everyone respects the Second Amendment rights of every American.

Recently, New Mexico's Democratic Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued an emergency order suspending the right to carry guns in Albuquerque and Bernalillo County for at least 30 days.

Lujan Grisham classified this ban on Second Amendment rights as an emergency public health order, connecting it to a threshold for violent crimes that was only met by the Albuquerque area. This ban applied to both open and concealed carry in almost every public place. Violating the ban would result in civil penalties and up to a \$5,000 fine.

This is tyrannical and unconstitutional – and a federal judge agrees. A U.S. District Judge blocked the part of the public health order that violates the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

When politicians overstep their authority in a time of crisis, that is how we lose our country. And that is exactly what happened in New Mexico. If our nation follows suit, we will lose the rights and

the Freedoms that our Founding Fathers fought and died for.

Unlike too many other states, South Dakota is a sanctuary for Second Amendment rights. In fact, the very first bill that I signed into law as Governor guarantees Constitutional Carry for all law-abiding South Dakotans. We made South Dakota the first state to not charge a fee for a concealed carry permit, and we strengthened our "Stand Your Ground" laws. We even have legislation that prevents exactly what Lujan Grisham tried to do in New Mexico. In South Dakota, state and local governments cannot use an emergency declaration as an excuse to infringe on Second Amendment rights.

In April, I signed an Executive Order on stage at the National Rifle Association's Institute for Legislative Action Leadership Forum. That Executive Order protects South Dakota's Second Amendment rights from being infringed upon by financial institutions. The EO blocked state agencies from contracting with large banks that engage in discrimination against firearm-related industries.

The United States Constitution may not always use plain language, but it is pretty straightforward when it comes to our right to defend ourselves. "The right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed."

The Second Amendment could not be any clearer.

In Federalist Paper 46, James Madison writes, "ultimate authority, wherever the derivative may be found, resides in the

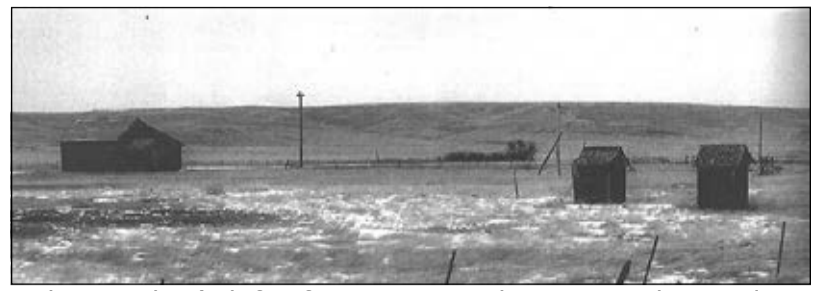

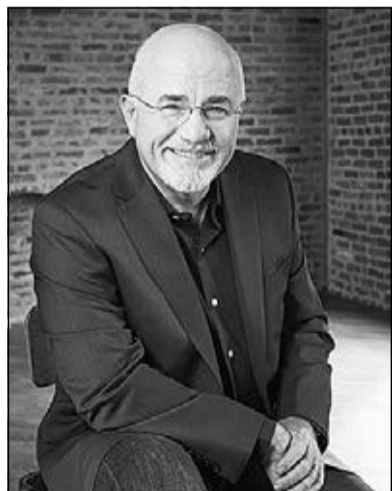

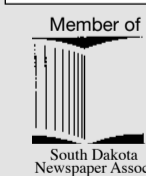

FAMILY OF FARMALLS

2023 marks the 100th anniversary of the Farmall tractor. This is a tip of the cap to the tractor that has been essential to farmers for generations, for my family and so many others.

In 1928, my Grandfather Harm Seeba, bought a Regular Farmall at the hardware store.

The Regular was in demand because it could be used for many purposes, and it started easily due to the lift of the crank. Included in its many uses were plowing and pulling embedded rocks out of the field. In 1937 Grandfather bought an F20, the first red Farmall. Red made the tractor more visible on the road and the F20 had better steering and more power! In 1950, when the F20 wasn't running well, local mechanic Jake Cramer was asked to overhaul it. Roller bearings which were removed on the crankshaft were luckily under warranty at the local dealer so \$45 later Grandfather had his F20 back in the field.

In 1953, the F20 was traded in at Beresford. Grandfather's neighbor bought it without even looking at it on the lot. That new owner drove it from Beresford right past Grandfather's place and parked it at its new home just one and a half miles north. It was now owned by Francis Gedstad, my uncle on the other side of my family. This tractor is still owned by Francis' son, Gayle.

My Grandfather, Theodore Gedstad, and his brother Kelmar went to a large sale with an advisor to tell them which tractors to bid on. They were able to buy a 1929 Regular, a cultivator, and a plow for a grand total of \$600.

In 1946, my Dad, Irving Gedstad, and his brother Francis bought an F30 Farmall in Pipestone, Minnesota. At that time tractors were hard to find so, although they wanted an M, they settled for an F30. The F30's brakes didn't work right and the radiator leaked. At that time, there was a requirement that tractors being sold were to be in A1 condition so Dad wrote a letter explaining the problems and was told to take the tractor to the dealership in Hurley. The 28 mile roundtrip at 12 miles per hour was well worth getting the tractor in great shape.

In 1948 they bought an F14 and both Dad and Uncle Francis bought their long-awaited M's in 1952 from Mike Angana Implement in Lennox.

The M proved to be a tractor capable of all tasks. It was the subject of the first story I wrote.

My Dad bought an 806 in 1972. It was the first diesel tractor he owned and, after the first trip across the field, it was easy to see the pure joy on his face! I learned that tractors were a gift from God. When I pulled an 18 foot disc down Highway 18 and Grandfather Seeba would be walking in the field, he would see me and wave, hand high above his head.

I often thought about how different things were when he was a young farmer. Completing our family of Farmalls were a black striped 966 that Francis purchased in 1976 and a 1086 purchased by my Dad in 1985.

The Farmall was designed in 1923 to replace horses and still serves as a workhorse on farms across the world.

Grain Bin Safety

Using grain bins is often essential to your farm operation, but it can add a level of danger if the proper safety precautions are not taken. Here is a refresher on grain bin safety to ensure you have a safe and productive season.

Post warning signs outside the bins to make anyone who

may use them aware of the potential hazards.

Prohibit walking down grain and similar practices where an individual walks on grain to make it flow, as they may become trapped.

Check ladders and safety ropes to ensure they are in good working condition.

Provide anyone entering the grain bin with a safety harness that prevents them from going any deeper than their waistline. This will allow them to be pulled out in the event of an accident.

Never enter a grain bin without someone to provide help in case of an accident.

Test the air within the grain bin to make sure that it is free of hazardous gas and has an adequate amount of oxygen prior to entering the grain bin.

Use continuous ventilation prior to entry if air quality is not suitable for working inside the bin. Providing workers with dust respirators can also help safeguard against respiratory issues.

Don't allow children to play in or around grain bins or other large, associated equipment.

Ensure a permit is issued for each instance a worker enters a bin or silo, certifying that safety precautions outlined by OSHA.gov have been implemented.

8 Ways to Improve Farm Security

Your tools and equipment are essential to earning your livelihood, but are you doing all you can to ward off farm theft? While insurance policies are an essential first step to protecting your assets in the case of loss, these extra security precautions can help prevent farm theft from happening in the first place.

Watching From Afar
Closed-circuit television (CCTV), also known as video surveillance, is one of the best ways you can protect your property from theft. Well-placed cameras can help you watch over your most vulnerable areas, and home security apps enable you to view your property remotely. For a cheaper option, consider dummy CCTV cameras — often times, the appearance of cameras is enough to deter thieves.

Keeping It Out of Sight
Keeping your farm equipment out of plain sight so that it's not easily visible and accessible from the road is a simple way to avoid potential theft. And don't forget to keep outbuildings, yards and houses well lit. Whether you leave lights on or have them motion-activated, it will discourage criminals who don't want to be seen.

Putting Fido to Work
Use animals as deterrents. A good watch dog around the property with proper signage such as "Beware of Dog" is effective. Geese are also good noise makers when strangers come.

Locking It All Up
Store what you can inside outbuildings that can be locked up tight with locking bars or high-security padlocks. Fuel tanks, large equipment and tools should be locked up inside. Store power tools in lockable containers that are

also attached to the ground or wall. Keep a record of serial numbers or log all pieces of equipment so you can keep track of equipment in the event of farm theft.

Taking Away the Keys
Store ATVs or UTVs inside an outbuilding and remove the keys when they're not in use. Keep these in the house with you or in a different location. You can also use wheel clamps or locking posts to keep them secure. Consider parking larger vehicles in front of doors to complicate access.

Leaving a Mark
Leave a security marking on equipment and register them when you can. Put your zip code on the top of your trailers so they can be easily seen from the sky. You can paint your equipment in bright colors or put on a warning decal that will help them be spotted if they are taken. For your livestock, mark them using a recommended method and/or look into microchipping.

Using Layers of Security
The more security precautions you take, the less likely it is that you'll have to deal with stolen farm machinery. Adding immobilizers or chip keys, or removing batteries and wheels helps you keep your peace of mind.

Working Together
Form a rural watch group with nearby neighbors and friends to look after each other's properties. Jot down descriptions of strangers and vehicles including license number, location, date and time. This can be helpful to police if crimes occur in the area.

If you are the victim of a theft, reach out to your Farm Bureau agent and they will help start the claims process.



Tips For Safer Farming

Tractor accidents, grain entrapment and injuries from ornery livestock are just some of the dangers agricultural workers face every day. In fact, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health says agriculture is one of the most hazardous industries in the United States.

In 2016, the agricultural industry had a rate of 21.4 deaths per 100,000 workers, and each day agricultural workers experienced 100 non-fatal, lost-work-time injuries.

Agricultural dangers are not limited to North America. In Ireland, farm accidents have increased by 13 percent in the last five years and by 31 percent in the last decade, according to a national survey of farm accidents conducted by the Teagasc National Farm Survey. Furthermore, 97 percent of all farm accident victims required medical treatment.

Farms are dangerous places, and while carelessness can and does contribute to many incidents, accidents also take place during routine, seemingly safe activities. These farm safety guidelines can help lower the risk of injuries.

- Know farm equipment. Read and follow all instructions in the equipment operation manuals. In addition, attend local farm safety workshops to learn more about specific equipment and products.
- Conduct routine safety

checks. Look around buildings and grounds for obvious hazards, such as fire hazards and hazardous materials, including farm chemicals that are not stored correctly.

- Practice cleanliness. Maintain clean and neat work areas with tools stored properly and out of the way after use.

- Be mindful of your clothing and hair. Many accidents involve a power take-off system, or PTO, which is a common component of large rotary mowers, tractors and forage choppers. Clothing can easily get caught in an engaged but unguarded PTO stub. It's easy for laces or coveralls to become wrapped around a spinning stub shaft. The PTO driveline and other protrusion points also can be dangerous if people do not pay attention.

- Use rollover protection structures. ROPS can be used on tractors and other equipment to prevent injuries. In addition, wear seat belts and employ other safety equipment as advised.

- Avoid extra passengers. It can be tempting to take the

kids for a spin, but do not allow additional passengers to ride on agricultural equipment.

- Exercise caution when handling chemicals. Take extra precautions when handling any chemicals, including pesticides.

- Wear protective gear. Wear appropriate gear and equipment as outlined by NIOSH or the Mine Safety and Health Administration. Make sure the skin, feet, ears, eyes, and hands are protected at all times.

- Employ lock out/tag out control. This is a process where one can work on equipment only after every energy source has been controlled, such as hydraulic, pneumatic, mechanical, and electrical, according to Rural Mutual Insurance Company. Turning off equipment and using certain controls or locks on devices can prevent equipment from restarting before it is safe to do so.

Farm safety should be a priority for owners, their families and employees so that agricultural injuries can be reduced.

The extra point run put the score at 8-0 at 9:34. Canton was intercepted on their 3rd play giving the Quarriers the ball at the Canton 40 then from the 28 DR ran the ball up the middle and missed tackles helped DR get into the end zone but they were stopped on their extra point attempt making the score 14-0 at 7:17. Canton was forced to punt giving DR the ball back on the Hawks 21 and more missed tackles hurt the Hawks as they got to the 5 then scored on their next play as they ran over our left side for the touchdown and with the extra point run they increased their lead to 22-0 at 4:28. Canton started to move the ball on this series with runs by Teague Granum and Cain Wallner along with a pass

Road Trip! Homecoming Tradition It takes Student Council to plan it and School Spirit to make it fun

For Junior Bailey Brooks, being in Student Council and helping plan this year's Homecoming has been a blast.

This year like every year, the HHS Student Council has taken charge of homecoming. This year's theme: Road Trip! A week's worth of activities September 24 - 30 will include coronation, a variety show, tailgating and a full "spirit week" with dress-up days, the annual parade and, of course, the football game. This year the HHS football team plays Washington Friday, September 29. The week caps off with

on Earth Day, wrapping presents at the Christmas Choir Concert and providing childcare at parent-teacher conferences. We also attend the Student Council State Conference in Rapid City," explains Madeline.

"Student Council hits the ground running the very first month of school. We kick off each year with a major, all-school event - Homecoming."

Plan early, plan plenty

Lots of time and manpower are necessary to put together all the activities and coordinate all the special days during Homecoming Week says Madeline.

"In the end, we manage to plan a great week of dress-up days. We want to represent everyone and make sure all Tigers are excited to participate."

Committee work is what makes homecoming successful says Madeline.

"There is an Events Committee to plan the day of fun on Friday, a Royalty Committee that plans coronation, the parade and the royalty events, as well as a Dance and Decorations Committee which plans all aspects of the Saturday dance as well as school decorations. The drama club takes care of the Variety Show."

Homecoming Week is full of events during and after school.

"We encouraged everyone to attend the soccer and volleyball games and get involved in the Tiger tailgating prior to the games. Wednesday will be the glow dodgeball tournament at night in the field house. It is a fan favorite. Friday before the pep rally there are tournaments like volleyball and girls' powderpuff football, a pep rally and an early release."

To make Homecoming a bit more affordable, an all-access pass is available for \$20 that includes admission for Coronation, the Variety Show, Dodgeball, Tiger Tailgate and the Homecoming. If students don't buy an all-access pass individual admission will be collected at the door and is cash only.

Student Council also created and sold a special Homecoming t-shirt.

Creating school spirit is foremost.

"We build school spirit for this event by encouraging all sports and clubs to participate, and also really promoting the Homecoming events weeks before," she said. "Harrisburg has outstanding school spirit that has built an amazing community. Look at the hundreds and hundreds of Harrisburg citizens that come out to watch the parade."

Being part of something bigger

Student Council members like being part of this huge school and community event that has so much tradition and history.

For historian Gracie Goldammer, planning homecoming makes her feel part of something.

"I love being able to share my ideas and those of others and incorporate them into

amazing events during Homecoming Week."

Committee work is what keeps Homecoming organized. Senior Ella Weide loved being part of planning coronation. "Last year I was part of planning coronation, and we all had so much fun! The juniors planned every part of the court's schedule and the finer details that come with it. I loved being able to make it fun and stress-free for all the royalty."

And for the Student Council president who is now a senior, Madeline says it's all about seeing the hard work pay off.

"Being part of Student Council, especially during homecoming, makes me feel so accomplished and helpful throughout the school and the community. I love to be behind the scenes, planning and coming up with events I get to watch my peers enjoy."

And because no freshmen are in the high school, extra effort is made to make those representatives feel included and part of the planning.

"During our whole group meetings, we have a zoom call set up between each building as well as two of our officers who drive to the Academy to be in person with the freshmen. Ms. Chambers remains at the Academy. The freshmen also have their own 'freshman committee' to organize Homecoming events at their school such as decorating, Friday events and announcing dress up day."

"The Parade must go on"

Every school's Homecoming has one tradition that seems to be theirs and theirs alone. For Harrisburg, it has been the Homecoming Parade.

"Small town parades are a big deal," says Principal Ryan Rollinger. "For Harrisburg it is their Homecoming parade; is an important part of how the community celebrates Homecoming. And each year our parade keeps getting bigger and bigger."

During the summer it looked doubtful that the parade would happen. But the decision was made to figure out a way. Even with the roundabout construction, the HHS Homecoming Parade will go on this year.

Mr. Rollinger worked with the City to create a new parade route that will stay south of Willow Street and west of Cliff Ave. construction. The parade staging will take place in the Harrisburg High School Parking lot then travel east down Willow, then head south through the neighborhoods, then west on Willow and return to the HHS parking lot.

"Even though the parade route which has been used for years and years was disrupted because construction, the District pushed for an alternative route," he said. "We worked with the City to come up with a suitable solution and created a new parade route graphic for the public to view."

The parade means lots of school and community participation. And the whole town shows up.

"All Harrisburg activities clubs, businesses and more can take part in creating their own float and throwing out candy," said Madeline.

As parade size and crowd size continue to grow, safety is an important consideration.



"Safety is important," said Mr. Rollinger. "It's important to keep kids back and out of the roads when candy is thrown into the crowds of spectators."

Saturday dance at the new Freshman Academy

Homecoming wraps up Saturday night, Sept 30 with a Homecoming Dance. The dance is slated from 7:30 -10:30 p.m. and will be held at a new venue that most of the upper classmen have not seen - the Freshman Academy Commons. The Dance will only be open to high school students from

HHS; no out-of-school dates can attend. Semi-formal attire is planned. The doors will open at 7 p.m. and will close at 8 p.m. Students from HHS can purchase a ticket for \$10 if they do not buy an all-access pass.

Bailey and her committee put the dance together.

"Student Council and Homecoming is a team effort," said Bailey. "As a junior, I have learned so much about what it takes to put a big event together and most of all, make it fun for everyone."

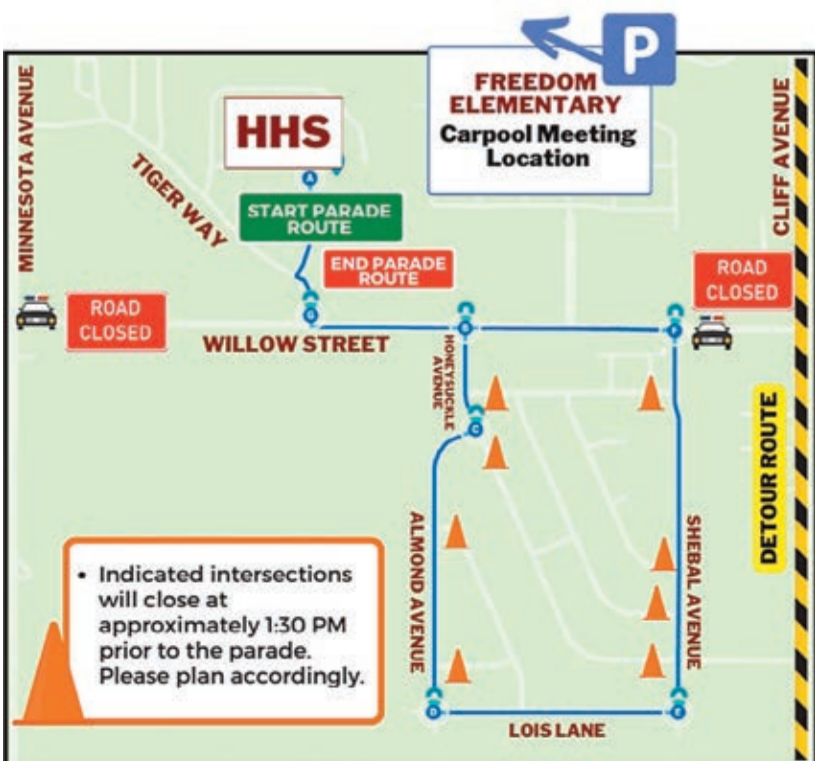

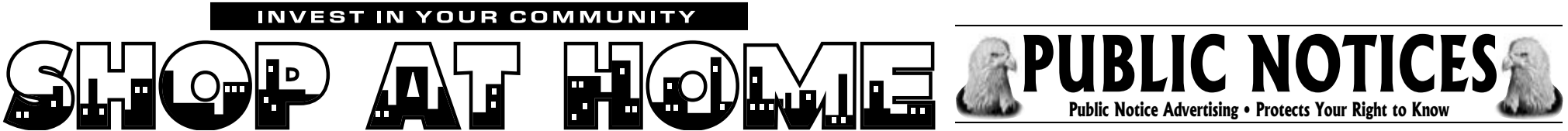
