This concert will feature over 200 6th - 8th graders from across the state performing in two bands under the direction of Mr. Randall Standridge and Dr. Larry Petersen. Canton is proud to have Hannah Fong, Ciera Ancell, and Kara Dose participating this year.



Ten years ago, Jerome and Tami Vandestroet's son Biruk started "Biruk's Egg Project" at the age of eight. He was born and raised for the first eight years of his life in Wuchale, Ethiopia. Being from this small, mountainous town in north central Ethiopia, he was familiar with seeing chickens around. So, he asked for eight chickens. Jerome bought one hundred because they had the space, figuring "one hundred chickens won't be much more work than eight." Little did they know that the reason Biruk wanted the chickens was to sell the eggs and send the money back to Wuchale, to aid kids like him. Biruk's experience in Wuchale was tough, living in deep poverty.

The K-12 Foundation held their annual Arts and Science Fair Sunday, March 2nd, at the Canton High School. Kids from Kinder-prep up to Seniors in high school displayed their art projects.

"The Passion and the Cross" will be opening at the Orpheum stage on Friday, March 22. They will be doing seven shows for the Easter season. This two-hour musical is one-act, with a cast of one-hundred-forty adults and children. For those of you who enjoyed the musical "Parables and Proverbs" that Lights Up Production hosted at the

Canton Performing Arts Center last fall, this show will be right up your alley. Canton cast includes Eliana (13)- King's servant/soloist and Rosalinda Kilmer-adult ensemble, Luke (16), Alec (13), Cassia (10), Elliana (10), and Lilly (6) Karstens. Lilly has assigned dialogue as she walks and talks with Jesus. Both Elianas share a scene where "servant" Eliana invites and leads Elliana the "crippled girl" to the King's wedding feast. Sonshine Williams is a new member to the cast and brings her strong operatic vocals to the adult ensemble.



Dave Serck always wanted to do taekwondo as a child, but growing up in the Inwood-Alvord, Iowa area, classes were not close by or convenient until he was older. Katlin Johnson, formerly Katlin Limoges, grew up in Canton. She graduated Canton High School in

2007 and went on to college at SDSU, receiving a Bachelor of Science in Health and Human Sciences. During December of 2020, she and her family moved back to the area, and they now live in Sioux Falls. Johnson has served as an Executive Director of an Assisted/Independent living community as well as a Memory Care Director, which helps people living/affected by Alzheimer's and other dementias. She is a Certified Dementia Practitioner, board member of the "SD Parkinson's Foundation" and a Diplomat with the "Greater Sioux Falls Chamber of Commerce." Cornerstone provides non-medical care including assistance with bathing, dressing, grooming, meals/grocery ordering, medication reminders, light housekeeping, laundry, pet care, assistance with exercise, companionship, and transportation for appointments/outings. They are VA contracted and support Veterans in understanding their options to receive financial support for their care. They also provide Respite care (giving family caregivers a break) Hospital Recovery Care, and being a certified dementia practitioner, Alzheimer's/Dementia Support. They partner with hospice to make sure the needs of the client are reached at times when hospice is available to be present. Caregivers work with therapy by assisting clients in following therapy driven exercises and work with skilled nursing and independent/assisted living communities to help meet the needs of those they serve. They also work with home health, which is the medical/nursing side of care in the home.

The city of Canton has an updated declaration of nuisance trees and order for removal of Ash trees was approved at the March 18, 2024 City commission meeting for all public (boulevard) ash trees to be removed by November 1, 2024.

The exterior now boasts new siding and glass garage doors that match the modern aesthetic of the new spaces. Inside, the bride's room was transformed into a luxurious bridal suite. The entire venue floor underwent renovations to ensure a cohesive and refreshed ambiance throughout. Thanks to the new addition, Gate City Events & Lodging can now provide expanded space for wedding receptions or a comfortable area for guests to take breaks during dancing, courtesy of the added fireplaces and access to the bar.

Erik Hall was born and raised in Canton. He then went to the University of Nebraska for Electrical Engineering and Computer Engineering. During college his favorite part of school was when they were able to build projects and see them move. After college he worked for NSK, a company that makes ball bearings for the automotive industry. NSK had an automated assembly line process, and it was his job to design, build, and repair the machinery which created the bearings. Hall moved back to South Dakota in 2015 and began working for a local systems integrator that did a lot of work in Industrial Agriculture plant designing and building. Working there he realized that he loved it so much he wanted to start his own company. Hall knew if he were to start the company, he would need to have a mechanical engineer partner, so he reached out to his friend Jeremy Myer. In September of 2023, after years of planning, Hall was able to start "Myer-Hall Machine Works" with his business partner Jeremy Myer.

"Myer-Hall Machine Works" is a machine builder company that goes

hand in hand with problem solving for customers. If a customer has an issue that they need a fix for, they will partner with them to design and build a machine that solves the issue. Sometimes these designs involve robotics.

"The most common issue we see is that companies can't hire enough people to do the jobs that are needed. Having a machine that will do the job, or that makes the job easier, allows the people that companies are able to hire more productive."- Erik Hall

The Canton High School had 67 graduates walk across the stage this Saturday, May 11th. The Class of 2024 was known for their strength and academic achievements. There were 26 students who were regent scholars who have completed a rigorous course load above the required graduation requirements. This includes 4 higher-level math courses, 4 higher-level science courses, and two foreign language courses or a combination of foreign language and CTE courses. They have completed this coursework with a 3.0 GPA and no grade lower than a C. The recipients of this award will earn a certificate that will allow them automatic entrance into any SD college or university.

The Canton Economic Development Corporation (CEDC) in partnership with EXP Development introduces Monarch Village Subdivision. This is a masterplan subdivision consisting of approximately 64.2 acres of land with approximately 50 acres of the total being developable for housing in the City of Canton. The remaining portion of land will serve to meet the engineering aspects of the project, while also providing future tenants and homeowners with adequate green space as well as a parks system that will be uniquely designed by Charles Yi, a real-estate investor with a portfolio that spans the globe to include experience developing within the State of South Dakota. One of his partners, Mel McGowan, is an eclectic, with a background in film and creative design during a decade long stint at the Walt Disney Company. The hope is this unique background will serve the project well in providing a subdivision with more character and unique value than typically seen in a subdivision within an historically rural community in the Midwest. The subdivision is being permitted to develop approximately 83 single-family residential lots and up to 200 multi-family and mixed-use residential units. It is currently being planned for a four-phase buildout dependent on market demand. The goal is to provide affordable, workforce housing that is uniquely designed in a suburb setting.



Rich Beitzel had several items from his grandpa that he wore and accumulated from WWI. Jorund Bernhofson lived

north of Canton and farmed the land. He was a Corporal in the 147th Field Artillery 41 Division. Beitzel received the uniform after it has been passed down from generation to generation. The uniform is over 100 years old and still in good condition. He donated the uniform to the Sioux Falls Alliance which is the South Dakota Military Heritage Alliance non profit corporation. The uniform is currently displayed by the pistol range



in the Alliance building.

Congratulations are in order for Austin Block of Haisch pharmacy, as she was awarded at SDSU for "2024 Pharmacy Preceptor of the Year." The preceptor oversees student pharmacists for a three to five week rotation at some point in their pharmacy school curriculum. Each student has five different rotations for three to five weeks at different pharmacies where they work alongside a pharmacist. The students then nominate preceptors for the award.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce held their annual meeting last Thursday night. Regular business was held along with new business of Jeff Tanner resigning as President of the Chamber effective June 15. Tanner will be focusing his time as the economic director of Canton. The new President is Lisa Hinker; Vice President Melissa Tyrell along with secretary; Sara Steffensen will remain treasurer. Lisa Hinker commented "This change came quickly but I am ready to take on the challenge."

Business of the year was awarded to Companion Animal Clinic. The business has been at its current location for 20 years. The community said this about the business: They take great care and have a passion for animals and excellent service. They care about pets they see and their families. The staff takes the time to treat every animal as their own.

The Organization of the Year went to the Canton Wrestling Club. The wrestling club starts with kids as young as five through high school. The youth program created what the high school program is today. Many hours of training and team building is held in the off season and out of the wrestling room.

The Citizens of the year went to Jeremy Ask and Jeremy Swenson. These two balance each other perfectly and the team aspect is the foundation for the individual



success.

Dirt work has started for the future home of the Lincoln County Justice Center. Commission Jibben said, "He is excited to get the project started. Lincoln County is growing fast and needs to keep up with the population. The Justice Center was on the agenda at the April 30 meeting. Commissioner Jim Schmidt stated the board needed to appoint a Justice Center Building Committee, made up of at least two commissioners, which shall have the authority to make timely decisions and sign documents, up to \$100,000, for the construction of the Lincoln County Justice Center project. Chief Civil Deputy State's Attorney, Drew DeGroot was present if any commissioner had any questions.

Construction has started for the new 4-Plex at the previous Gateway Motel location. There will be four apartments, two on the bottom and two on the top. The top level will be zero entrance with access from the alley. Completion is set for October of 2024, with the move-in date projected to be November 1st, 2024. Craig and Kari Winkvist decided to build a 4-plex for two reasons after the roof was torn off the building from the "derecho" storm. They believed there was a greater need in Canton for housing than for motel rooms. Also, with building costs the way they are right now, there was no way the insurance proceeds would have built a new motel. There were certainly some obstacles they had to overcome, but they received great support from members of the Planning and Zoning Committee, as well as the City Commission.

C-Hawk boys finish the season with a 12-9 record.

C-Hawk Boys Come up Short on Comeback Against Dell Rapids

The Canton C-Hawk boys basketball team hosted the Dell Rapids Quarriers on Thursday the 4th and lost a close game 65-61 to put their season record at 3-3.

C-Hawk Boys Get a Pair of Victories This Week

The Canton boys team traveled to Elkton on Tuesday then hosted Beresford on Friday night and earned a pair of wins to move their season record to 5-3.

Canton traveled to Elkton and the game was close in the first half when both teams scored 16 quarter points then in the 2nd Canton was outscored 18-13 to trail 34-29 at halftime. Canton came out strong in the 3rd quarter as they took the lead with 30 quarter points and the defense held Elkton to 11 making the score 59-45 heading in the 4th. The Hawks cruised in the final quarter scoring 20 points to earn a 79-63 victory.

Canton next hosted Beresford on Friday night and they jumped out to a 17-11 first quarter lead the after both scored 16 in the 2nd they held a 33-27 halftime lead. Canton improved on their lead to 50-41 heading into the final quarter and they increased their lead by scoring 25 points to finish the game with a 75-52 victory.

Boys Basketball Win Three Over Weeks Action

The Canton C-Hawk boys basketball team improved their season record to 8-3 with 3 victories over the week when they defeated Tri Valley, SF Lutheran and Deuel.

The Hawks hosted Tri Valley on Tuesday and they won 68-54.

Canton then traveled to SF Lutheran on Friday night and the Hawks won 66-25.

Saturday the Hawks traveled to Madison for the Dak 12 vs NEC tourney and the



Hawks faced Deuel and came home with a 81-79 victory to put their record at 8-3.

C-Hawk Boys Basketball Improve to 9-4

The Canton C-Hawk boys basketball team improved their season record to 9-4 after losing to SF Christian then on Friday they defeated the Canistota.

Canton traveled to Sioux Falls Christian on Tuesday and were defeated by the #1 ranked team in Class A 89-73 as they jumped out to a 27-18 lead after the first quarter then they held a 47- 28 lead at halftime. Canton scored 23 in the 3rd quarter to SFC's 23 points then in the final quarter the Hawks outscored SFC 22-19 to fall 89-73 for their 4th loss of the season to 9 wins.

Canton next traveled to Canistota on Friday night and played the 10-3 Hawks and came home with a 65-50 victory for their 9th win of the season.

C-Hawk Boys Basketball Drops Two During Weeks Action

The Canton C-Hawk boys basketball team traveled to Baltic on Thursday the 8th and lost 73-59 and then hosted Madison on Saturday the 10th and mounted a fierce comeback but came up short and lost 80-74 to put their record to 9-7.

C-Hawk Boys win 2 of 3 Over Weeks Action

The Canton C-Hawk boys basketball team played 3 games last week and came away with 2 victories with wins over Parker on Monday then an overtime win over Hanson on Thursday but suffered a loss against West Central on Tuesday to move their season record to 10-8 as they head into Region action on March 1st.

Canton hosted Parker on Monday and jumped out to a lead by outscoring the Parker 21-9 in the first then held a 42-22 lead at halftime. In the 3rd the Hawks increased their lead to 30 when they scored 22 points in the quarter and held Parker to 12 then in the final 8 minutes the Hawks held them to 8 points to their own 11 points as they cruised

to the 75-42 win.

The Hawks then hosted West Central on Tuesday night and the Trojans came in and took a quick lead as they outscored the Hawks 22-15 in the 1st quarter and held a 42-20 lead at halftime. Canton lost ground in the 3rd quarter as they couldn't find the basket and only scored 5 quarter points as the Trojans scored 26 to take a 68-25 lead heading into the 4th. Canton scored 16 in the final quarter to 8 from WC but ended up falling 76-41.

C-Hawks Boys Basketball Team Ends Regular Season 12-8

Canton was slammed with destruction from the recent flood. For comparison, the flood in 2014 poured out around thirteen inches of rain. The nineteen inches of rain in 48 hours this past weekend created a battle for many of the homeowners and businesses in the flood's path of destruction. Beaver Creek along with the Big Sioux River were overflowing and flooding in places from how much accumulated into them. Lake Lakota has even refilled from the rain. Roads and highways have flooded into places, others washed out, this creating detours for drivers. The rain started on Thursday during the day, pelting the area again throughout the night into Friday when it continued to rain. The streets started to turn into rivers, with some streets flooding multiple times. One time on Friday, the sandbags north of town also had water break through them, which caused streets to flood once again. People watched as the water inched devastatingly close to their homes and started filling their basements. Early Saturday morning the rain finally relented, and the streets slowly started receding. Saturday and Sunday were long days of cleanup for a sizable portion of Canton, hauling items out of basements, tearing up flooring, contemplating what was salvageable, trips to the dump, and catching up on much-needed rest.

Bomgaars made three trips down to Sioux City to restock supplies, sometimes taking two to three hours to get back to Canton because of detours and traffic. They took the pickup down to get two pallets at a time of vacuums, sump pumps, shop vacs and whatever else was needed. Last weekend was steady for the staff as they were busy all weekend with customers hoping to find the needed tools to save their homes.

At Canton Home and Farm, Sterling Heath called United Hardware to see if they could send up an emergency shipment like they did in 2014 during the flood, but they were unable to. Then when he was talking with Vicki at United Hardware, they were able to place an order, with Vicki agreeing to meet Sterling at the Madison exit with sump pumps, vacuum, shop vacs, etc. They haven't been able to get any dehumidifiers ordered unfortunately. Farmers State Bank has gift cards available for Canton Home and Farm at Love Inc. Canton Home and Farm would like to thank everyone for shopping locally.

Michael Levi Engel is the owner and founder of MECA Construction. He has been working in construction since 2004. The company relocated to Canton as of December 23, 2022. Engel is a residential general contractor licensed and insured in South Dakota. The company works with residential homes as a "footing to finish" company constructing anything home

related. "We value God, our country and our hometown," Engel said. He worked tirelessly for a total of 66 hours during the flood last weekend.

"I originally built these because I needed a place for a shop myself," said Wurtz. Right now there are two units to be rented out with a goal to add more in the future. David is the owner of Wurtz Construction which does pole buildings, steel roofing and more. He has also done several other projects in the area before this one.



Troy Cuzican opened Sapphire Moon, a private tattoo studio, located at 102 W. 5th Street in Suite 204 right here in Canton. His availability is flexible, with day or night appointment times. "As long as I'm aware of time and place I'm there," he said. Tattoos are price quoted by specific tattoo, size placement, and the amount of detail, with a minimum set at \$100.

The official groundbreaking ceremony was held Tuesday, July 30th, on 40 acres of land on the Northwest side of Canton. The Justice Center will include offices for the State's Attorney and Public Defenders. The ground floor will include several court rooms along with three more courtrooms and a hearing room on the second floor. A Jury Assembly room will allow members of the public a comfortable area to check-in and wait their court assignment. The center will also have a built in shell space for future expansion and jail if needed. This \$54.8 million dollar project is set to be completed by the fall of 2026 and house the Second Judicial Circuit Courtrooms. Robin Houwman, presiding judge, said "This new courthouse will be more than a building, this will ensure that every citizen in the county has access to justice."



Brady Barr has brought his shop to a storefront in Canton. "Lettuce Sell Your Stuff" is located at 121 East 5th Street, which is on the corner of businesses south of the courthouse. The surplus and consignment store contains a wide array of furniture, but also includes a variety of items such as antiques, clothes, sporting

goods, and electronics. Barr is hoping to have a new selection of items every month. The business started in August of 2023, as a service to help people sell things they no longer need. This is a perfect way for those preparing for a move or cleaning out their home to have an option for help in these matters, and to turn those unneeded items into cash.



CHS Worthing started planning an expansion project September 14, 2023. Majority of the work started underground with the above ground work in the last few weeks. There were 451 auger cast piles that were poured to support this big elevator which consisted of over 3,300 yards of concrete poured under ground. Next the team focused on installing 400,000 pounds of rebar into the Elevator Mat. This mat will evenly distribute the weight of the elevator across the deep foundation piles. The Elevator Mat will be a three-foot-thick concrete slab, requiring nearly 2,000 yards of concrete or 250 cement trucks.

FEMA set up a disaster relief inside the Canton Depot. This temporary Disaster Relief Center also includes Small Business Association and other information to help with the flood recovery process.

In response to the flooding in June, Allison Kemner of "My Timeless Day Quilting & Sewing" along with June Fossum, and Catherine Erickson of "Canton Quilt Retreat" began a quilt drive. Their mission is to gift a quilt to each family in the Canton, Hawarden, and Rock Valley areas who had their home red tagged or lost everything due to the flooding. They hope the gift of a quilt to these families will aid in the healing process, by showing they are loved and not forgotten during this challenging time.
